

TYPES OF ADVERBS

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Adverbs add information and split into several categories based on function.



Adverbs of Manner

Describes HOW an action happens.

Ex: He answered the interview questions **confidently**.



Adverbs of Time

Tells WHEN or for HOW LONG.

Ex: The package arrived **yesterday**.



Adverbs of Place

Tells WHERE an action happens.

Ex: The kids are playing **outside**.

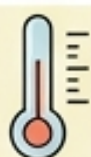


Adverbs of Frequency

Tells HOW OFTEN.

List: always, usually, often, sometimes, rarely, never.

Ex: My grandmother **always** calls.



Adverbs of Degree

Tells INTENSITY or extent of adj, adv, verb.

Ex: The presentation was **fairly** convincing.



Sentence Adverbs

Frames/comments on the entire sentence.

Ex: **Frankly**, I don't think the plan will work.



Conjunctive Adverbs

Connects two ideas, shows relationship.

List: however, therefore, moreover, meanwhile, nonetheless, consequently.

Ex: delayed; **nevertheless**, we made connection.

TIP: PUNCTUATION

When joining two clauses, use a semicolon before and a comma after. Improper use creates a run-on sentence.
