

WHAT ARE THE PRONOUNS?



A **pronoun** is a word that replaces a noun so you don't have to keep repeating it. You already use pronouns. These, some of the most common ones:

PERSONAL PRONOUNS (Subject & Object)

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Definition a word that replaces a noun, says are the common elements object:

SUBJECT

I, you, he, she,
it, we, they

OBJECT

me, you, him, her,
it, us, them

The teacher called him twice. ->
Teacher is the subject; **him** is the object.

Common Mistake:

- ✗ Me and my sister... ->
- ✓ My sister and I...

Why: The band my sister can is instead if they are one by selling, they fast to those children.

POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

Definitions **possessive** possessive ones:

mine, yours, his, hers, ours, theirs

Example: This suitcase is **mine**, that one is **yours**.

Tip:

Determiner + noun
-> **my phone**
Pronoun alone

Common Mistake:

- ✗ Is this notebook **your's**? ->
- ✓ **yours**?

REFLEXIVE & INTENSIVE PRONOUNS

myself, yourself, itself, themselves

Reflexive: She taught **herself** to fix a tire.

Intensive: The manager **herself** approved the refund.



Common Mistake:

- ✗ ...invoice to **myself**.
- ✓ ...invoice to **me**.

DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS

Demonstrative pronouns nearly definition.

Example: **This** is the best coffee.



	Near	Far
Singular	this	that
Plural	these	those

Example: **This** is the best coffee.

RELATIVE PRONOUNS

who, whom, whose, which, that

Example: The technician **who** fixed my laptop...



Tip: who vs. whom

The: **who** and **whose**, you may substitute their same, **whom**.

INTERROGATIVE PRONOUNS

Interrogative pronouns definition.

Example: **Which** of

who, whom, whose, what, which

Which of these jackets fits you better?

INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

everyone, someone, nothing, few, many, all, none

Example: **Someone** left their umbrella.

Tip: singular verbs

- ✓ **Everyone** is welcome.
